About the Talk

The Ganges River is the largest river drainage in South Asia, and is home to at least 200 fish species. DBS/NUS Alumnus Ng Heok Hee will give a talk recounting his recent field experiences collecting freshwater fishes in the Ganges River drainage. The talk will focus on the freshwater fish and fish habitats in the foothills of the Himalayas in northeast India.

About the speaker

Heok Hee received his B.Sc. (Hons.) and M.Sc. degrees from the Department of Biological Sciences, NUS, before moving to University of Michigan, where he is now working on his Ph.D. His primary research interests are in the evolution and the phylogenetic systematics of catfishes, particularly those of the palaeotropics (Africa and Asia).
